## PROCEDURES FOR CHARITY QUILT DONATION

## DONATION QUILT, QUILTED, BOUND, AND READY TO DONATE:

- Obtain an Information Card from Joyce Owens or Pam Warner
- Complete the card and attach it to the guilt with a safety pin
- Return it to Joyce, who will tag it, log it in, and oversee the donation to charity

# REQUEST FOR BATTING TO BE USED FOR CHARITY QUILTS:

- Guild batting for charity quilts is stored by Lou (Evette) Gallo and Richard (Kathy) Payne. Make requests to either of them, in writing, including the size of the piece(s) needed.
- They will cut the batting requested and set it on the pool table for pickup at the next monthly meeting. Joyce Owens will be notified of the request for charity quilt batting.
- If the batting is needed prior to the next guild meeting, arrangements can be made to pick up at their home.
- Larger pieces of batting should be saved and sewn together for baby quilts.

#### FABRIC IN THE MASONIC LODGE CLOSET:

- This fabric has been donated to the guild for charity purposes. It is organized in bins by yardage amount.
- It takes many hours to organize this fabric. When looking through the selections, keep it neat and orderly.

There are several members who will provide longarm quilting service for quilts that will be donated to charity through the guild. Members are encouraged to do their own quilting by domestic machine for small quilts. The following are the guidelines provided by these volunteers.

### DONATION QUILT TOP IN NEED OF QUILTING BY LOU GALLO OR RICHARD PAYNE:

- The quilt top submitted to these guild volunteers will be edge-to-edge quilted on a longarm machine. You supply the backing, which must be 6" wider (8" wider for Richard Payne) and 6" longer than the entire quilt. (He will cut the guild's batting for your quilt top.)
- The maximum width of the quilt top is 72". Pieced backings cannot have full-length vertical seams.
- An adequate length of  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " binding that is cut, sewn together, folded in half, and pressed must also be included with the guilt top and backing in a separate plastic bag.
- Fill out the Information Card and attach it to the quilt with a safety pin. Give the quilt, backing, and binding to either Lou or Kathy Payne.
- Once the quilting is complete, it will be returned to the maker or another volunteer to bind. When fully finished, the quilt will be given to Joyce who will tag it, log it in, and oversee the donation to charity.

# DONATION QUILT TOP IN NEED OF QUILTING BY JEANNE LEURQUIN

- Call Jeanne to see if she can quilt your quilt top edge-to-edge on her longarm machine. You supply the backing and batting, which must be 6" wider and 6" longer than the entire quilt.
- An adequate length of 2½" binding that is cut, sewn together, folded in half, and pressed must also be included with the quilt top and backing in a separate plastic bag.
- Fill out the Information Card and attach it to the quilt with a safety pin. Give the quilt, batting, backing, and binding to Jeanne.
- Once the quilting is complete, it will be returned to the maker or another volunteer to bind. When fully finished, the quilt will be given to Joyce who will tag it, log it in, and oversee the donation to charity.
